I had a set of custom ear plugs made at a Rally in New Mexico a while back. After I found how effective and comfortable the plugs are, I had a set of permanent plugs made with speakers molded in. # PhanPhaq Riding Tips

Q. How far over the posted speed limit can I "safely" go?

A. The traditional rule of thumb – two-thirds the posted speed times pi over the square root of 2 -- is no longer recommended (76% of licensed riders – and 98.8% of unlicensed riders – can't solve this anymore even with a calculator). The contemporary

rule of thumb, as everybody now knows, is 10. Unfortunately, nobody knows if this means 10 percent, 10 MPH or maybe 10 KPH. For safety and simplicity, we recommend you use the average of these values, to the nearest three decimals. Here's an example:

Posted limit: 65. Speedo error: 8% high. Using the average, you can probably avoid a ticket going 78.877 on the speedo. Simple, right? Disclaimer: Doing long division problems in your head while riding has been shown to be equivalent to a

BAC of about 0.08, so what this means in reality is that you will probably be pulled over on suspicion of DUI, rather than just for speeding. Using an abacus while riding is also not recommended (wind can introduce calculation errors).

PS: police are not obligated to obey rules of thumb; besides, randomly variable negative reinforcement is a great way to derange target subjects.



Regardless of where a motorcyclist lives, he or she knows that by participating in a Ride for Kids® event, they are helping children diagnosed with brain tumors, both in their own community and throughout the world. With the continued decrease in federal funding for childhood brain tumor research, their efforts are even more important to the welfare of these children.

"In 2003, we announced the creation of the Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation Institute at Duke," said Mike Traynor, PBTF president. "While our hope is to fast forward childhood brain tumor research through the concentrated efforts of the Institute, we will continue our national and international basic brain tumor research programs, our sponsorship of leading brain tumor symposia and our many patient family support programs. We have now stepped up to the next level of research and into the most complete and compelling pediatric brain tumor research program in the world."

Every year, individuals, motorcycle dealers and motorcycle clubs raise thousands of dollars in their communities to support the PBTF's mission. In 2003, Scott and Mary Jo White of Gilbert, Arizona were the Top Fundraisers with a total of \$51,500. They raise funds through the Nikki's Hope Foundation in memory of their daughter, Nikki, who succumbed to her brain tumor in 1998. The Top Dealer in the nation was Des Plaines Honda in Des Plaines, Illinois with a total of \$79,772. Gold Wing Road Riders Association (GWRRA) Illinois Chapter G2 was the Top Club in the country with a total of \$84, 205.

For the 20th consecutive year, the Ride for Kids® program celebrated a record fundraising season. The Foundation is pleased to announce that 88 percent of the funds raised are distributed through its programs. "At a time when there is so much uncertainty in the economy, I would like to thank the motorcyclists across the country for their continuing support of the Ride for Kids® program," Traynor commented. "We also are extremely grateful to the American Honda Motor Company for their support as our presenting sponsor since 1991."

#### Sacramento's 2003 event was very successful.

Some days are just perfect and Sunday, October 5, 2003 in Sacramento, California was just one of those days. With spectacular sunny conditions as a setting, some 825 motorcyclists, volunteers, fundraisers and patient families gathered at Auto Value Auto Parts Headquarters to celebrate the 11th Annual Sacramento Ride for



Kids®. After a year of hard work, these folks sure had a lot to celebrate raising \$171,797 for pediatric brain tumor research. Today, more children die from brain tumors than from any oth-

er childhood cancer. The Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation, supported by the Ride for Kids® program, funds critical research to find the cause and cure of childhood brain tumors.

After riding on rolling and winding scenic roads at the foothills of the Sierras in California's historic gold country, the motorcyclists and supporters came together for an amazing Celebration of Life program at the Amador County Fairgrounds in Plymouth, California. With a Ride for Kids® record-setting 23 brain tumor survivors on stage, motorcyclists listened to these special children and young adults share what their lives are like. The Redwood Riders were the Top Club with a total of \$16,185. The Top Shop was Wing Nut with a total of \$20,035. Paul Morey of Yuba City, California had an exciting Sunday afternoon! He was the winner of a brand new Honda motorcycle donated by American Honda Motor Company.
