October 8/9 is our biggest riding/camping event of the year. It takes place at the



Comparing The Garmin 2610, Street Pilot III, and the GPSMAP 276C

It might have been hashed out before, but I'll try to do it here

anyway. I didn't follow the old threads because I didn't need one, but then my SPIII died. I'll give away the ending first: I replaced my dead SPIII with the GPSMAP 276C.

The processors in the 2610 and 276C are WAY faster than the SPIII. If you already have a SPIII then you know you can spend time waiting for it: as you scroll the map, zoom in or out, or



approach a turn on a route. Sometimes the SPIII will try to show the close-up of the next turn, but it takes so long you're into the turn before the display shows anything. That doesn't happen with the new genera-

tion of processor speed. You can also use the "track up" display mode without seeing a blank screen 20% of the time.

The 2610 has a touch screen. There's some argument about whether this is useful with MC gloves on. When you want to spell something that you want to find (a street name, a city name, a business name), you can pop up a keyboard. This is much less tedious than the letter-by-letter scroll you have to do on the SPIII and 276C. The 2610 has a remote control so you can do stuff from a distance, but it seems like that would be generally useless on a bike.

The 2610 has sliders for your relative preference for certain road types. The 276C lets you tell it to "avoid" certain road types, but isn't as fine-grain. The 2610 and 276C both have configurable data displays, so each page can show the data you want to see, instead of the data Garmin thought you'd want to see.

For me, the 2610 was killed by two Garmin design decisions: First, it has no batteries so you can't take it off the bike and do route planning in your tent or restaurant. The SPIII takes six AA batteries, and the 276C has an internal battery pack which recharges any time the unit is powered.

Editor note. You can buy a rechargeable battery pack from BMW, p/n 72 60 7 679 224, for \$150 that clicks onto the back of the 2610 and lasts for 6 hours before needing a four-hour recharge. You can also plug the battery pack into AC current while you're viewing the gps. The battery pack will work with either the BMW or Garmin version of the 2610. The battery pack has two socket adapters for all of Europe and Great Britain.

Second, Garmin didn't include zoom in/out buttons on the 2610. This means you have to touch the thing three times to zoom in: once to pop up the zoom buttons, once to zoom in, and again to dismiss the buttons. And I don't know if you can do it by feel, without taking your eyes off the road, like you can with raised buttons on the SPIII and 276C.

I've read of people mounting the 2610's remote control next to the unit so they get the zoom in/out buttons and other features. And BMW makes a mounting bracket with buttons on it, including zoom. This still doesn't get you batteries.

The 2610 uses standard Compact Flash memory cards, so they're cheaper than the custom cards used by the SPIII and 276C. You



can even use a very large card in the 2610, which will hold full data for the whole country. I doubt I'll need more than the 256MB I got: I found I could put

data for everything west of the Rockies in there, and I don't travel wider than that. That same 256MB would have been cheaper for the 2610. (By the way, 128MB is not enough for all of CA and NV

plus southern OR, my "local" stomping grounds.)



The 276C has some technical features that they left off the "driver-friendly" 2610. For example, it has a longer track log (2000 points), and you can save 15 tracks. Also, you can configure the track log system to drop a breadcrumb every

X minutes, or X miles, or to maintain a resolution of X feet. This lets you save tracks for long trips, which the SPIII and 2610 can't do. When you get home you can download them to a computer for analysis and/or just for fun.

Garmin considers the 276C to be a "marine" unit, and it has a lot of boat-related features. Some are fun to play with in automotive mode, like the alarms for entering or leaving the proximity of selected waypoints. For off-road use there is the "highway" page which draws a virtual highway from one waypoint to the next.

The SPIII with batteries is the largest and heaviest. The 276C with batteries probably comes next, and the 2610 (having no batteries) is probably the lightest. I think the 276C's screen might be larger and have higher resolution than the others, but I don't know if it makes a big difference. The algorithms for displaying roads and road names seem to be about the same.

All three units can speak instructions for upcoming turns. I know what the SPIII sounds like, but not the others. I wouldn't use this on a bike.

You can download and read the user's manuals for all Garmin units, which lets you do much more detailed feature comparisons than you can for most products.

That's all I can think of right now. I hope this rundown of differences has been helpful. So far I'm happy with the 276C and after fiddling with a 2610 recently I don't regret my decision. Good luck and good shopping.
