#### Wild Weekend Ride

On Saturday Jeff and I rode 355 miles roundtrip from Folsom to Half Moon Bay. The key word for our motorcycle ride yesterday has to be 'WINDY'. A windy day during a road trip definitely means something different to the motorist versus the motorcyclist! Even with 425lbs. of machine under us ... Jeff and I encountered some winds that made us wonder if we would be able to stay on the road! Our original goal was to ride through the Altamont Wind Farm, however after experiencing wind gusts of up to 40 mph on the way, we detoured a little.

Our ride was a combination of country roads, 2-lane highway, to 10-lane freeway – wild! From Folsom to Mount Diablo we road along the Sacramento River Delta Road. There wasn't another car in site! From Rio Vista we continued onto some challenging highway driving – Highway 160 to 4 to Freeway 680 across the Dumbarton Bridge. On our way up to Half Moon Bay we actually had an opportunity to stop at





'Alice's. And, just when the day couldn't get any better we decided to drive up the coast to San Francisco through the Presidio over the Golden Gate Bridge! After crossing the bridge we stopped at the Marin Vista Point, which overlooks S.F. Bay. Unfortunately, just as we arrived we witnessed the sinking of a fishing boat – we found out later that 23 survived and 1 died from a heart attack (probably caused by the cold Pacific water temperature). We think the 23 survived only because there were so many other boaters in the area. The coast guard was on hand, but it was the fast work of fellow-boaters that plucked these folks out of the water.

After all of this it was time to go home. So back we went ... up highway 101 to Richmond Parkway ... onto Highway 80. What a blast! And, yes, we had a VERY good night's sleep last night -- AMEN!
