The President's Corner

The results are in for the first ever survey of the RCB membership, and I think they will be providing me with things to talk about for quite a while. First, I want to thank Phil Wood for putting it all together and collecting the responses into an easily understood report. I hope everyone has had a chance to read the results, but if you haven't, click on www.rcb.org/survey to do so. Many of the issues brought up have been on my mind for a while; many are currently being addressed, and some will require further research and appropriate action. The first one I would like to address is the question of camping vs. motel club events. Many people responded in the survey they do not camp and are not interested in sleeping in a tent, and they felt we do too much camping, so I looked at our list of weekend events and found them to be in a 50/50 proportion, with Manchester Beach being both because there are cabins available. Motel events are: Highway 36 to Eureka, Seagull Inn B&B, Volcano B&B, & Yerington Ride n' Bowl. We recently added a trip to Morro Bay that is motel oriented. Campouts are: Mt. Lassen and/ or Lake Mendocino, Soldier Meadows, Indian Creek, & Doran Beach. A motel option is usually available at the rallies, including the MOA National, Chief Joseph, Paonia and the Beemer Bash; only the Gypsy Tour is dedicated to camping only. My point is that you should be able to find an event or two in this list that fit your criteria, but if not, please let us know what you do want by attending the planning meeting and suggesting it.

The second issue is the club ride after the monthly meeting, which is something we are currently addressing. Many people expressed a concern for the ride being too fast for them; many others stated that they aren't given enough notice as to where the ride is going, still others said they don't like riding in such a large group. As for the first and third parts, we have started to split up the group into "spirited" and "relaxed" subsets when there is enough interest or a large number of riders, with the same route and destination. The second part, the destination, is proving a little hard-

er to deal with in planning ahead, as we often don't have a place in mind until the last minute. Weather plays a big part in the decision, along with road conditions and a reluctance to repeat routes. I am trying to put the destinations in my monthly column, and the forum on the website will have the route sheets ahead of time. We will be attempting to schedule next year's rides at the planning meeting in November, so if you have an idea for a ride please bring it there, we'd love to hear it.

The Yerington Ride 'n' Bowl was another huge success with about 25 members taking part in the biggest bargain event of the year. To quote Phil Wood, who was experiencing it for the first time, " Every RCB member should be here, it's such an incredible bargain and a lot of fun too." The ride to Genoa is always enjoyable with wonderful sandwiches at the Country Store, and there was even a nice twisty section in a river canyon on the way to Yerington. The bowling, of course, was the highlight for most of us, with Mike Robles in his new RCB bowling shirt tearing up the lanes, and I heard George Boyse was no slouch either. For those who don't bowl (like me) there is a movie theatre in the casino with my favorite sign on the door "No movie shown until we have 8 customers" which says something about the popularity of movies there. Fortunately there were more than 8 and we watched Public Enemy with Johnny Depp. \$6, another bargain. I hope even more people attend next year, and I want to say thanks to Kim Rydalch for putting it all together again.



North Thailand Anyone?

The TBF Travel Motorcycle Adventure travels through Northern Thailand on some of the best roads in the world for motorcycle enthusiasts. These roads are smoothly paved, with banked turns – lots of banked turns, have no enforced speed limits, and are very lightly traveled as they are mostly along the remote border areas of Thailand and Burma. This is the area; these are

the roads, where our trip leader and the guides on our trip grew up. We will have a unique adventure traveling by motorcycle experiencing a side of Thailand that most tourists never see.

Our trip begins in Chiang Mai, the ancient capital city of the 14th century Lanna Kingdom. We will spend the first two



nights at the Oriental Village Resort located in the foothills and rice fields of the beautiful countryside outside of town where we

will get acquainted with our motorcycles by riding into town and touring the famous temple of Doi Suthep located at the top of the holy mountain guarding Chiang Mai. The next seven nights are each spent in a new location after our days ride with our last night back in Chiang Mai, staying in the heart of town at a luxury high rise resort hotel. Each day we will begin our ride with an orientation and briefing on the conditions, attractions, stops and meal plans for the day. All of the gasoline used is included in the cost of the trip, each morning we will stop and fill up the bikes - that have been cleaned, lubed, checked and maintained each night after the days ride, before heading out.

Each days ride features incredible roads with winding, twisting turns climbing up, through, around and over the mountains. We will have stops at scenic waterfalls, to take a raft ride through a huge cave

and visit ancient tombs, to ride an elephant and to visit the long neck women of the hill tribe villages. We will visit the UNESCO World Heritage site of Sukhothai, one of Thailand's first capital cities, stay at a five-star hotel on an island in the middle of a river in Chiang Rai, and stop for lunch at the Golden Triangle staring out at three separate countries before watching sunset from a 'lost' Chinese mountain tea village and ending up at a beautiful resort nestled on the Mekok River. Each day will have local attractions such as centuries old Buddhist temples, natural hot springs, mountain viewpoints, colorful markets and local historical sites.

Guides will lead the ride each day, as well as provide tail support and middle support. There will also be a sag vehicle following the last riders and all luggage will be carried ahead and be waiting at each hotel when you arrive. Breakfast and lunch are included every day with most dinners together as a group either at the hotel or at a local restaurant. Also includes is a welcome dinner upon arrival, motorcycle and medical insurance, all admission fees and guide fees, and your motorcycle and all gasoline. The accommodations that we are staying at are all the best at each location ranging from 3.5 stars to 5 stars. The ride time each day is generally between 5 and 6 hours total, broken up between the morning and after lunch with stops usually every hour or so along the ride.

The shopping in Chiang Mai, and on the entire trip, is some of the best anywhere in the world. Almost all of the exotic imported goods sold at pricey stores here at home are made in Thailand, many in Chiang Mai. There is the Night Bazaar held each evening in Chiang Mai that covers a whole section of the city with streets shut down for vendors and shops to sell their goods, and along our trip there will be countless small markets and shops each with special gifts and handicrafts not found any-



where else. Thai massage is renowned for its healing and therapeutic effects and will be available after the ride each for about 7 dollars per hour. And of course nothing is better than an ice cold Thai beer and delicious spicy (or not, up to you, as they say in Thailand) Thai food.

In the area of Mammoth there are lots of activities: Devils Postpile Nat. Monument, Mammoth Ski Resort, where you can take the Gondola to the top of the mountain, Twin Falls is a good hiking spot, lots of lakes for fishing or just viewing, hiking trails and behind the campground there are many dirt trails that are doable on GS style bikes. Tioga Pass is only 20 miles away, so a day trip to Yosemite is easy-peezy.
