

#### **RCB Rider Skills Improvement Day - June 23**

Whether you commute every day, enjoy touring, or taking a leisurely day ride around town, it's time for a riding class. RCB will be offering a riding class on Sunday, June 16, 2013, at the Reno Fernley Raceway. The track is an environment that offers:

Debris free asphalt;

Corner workers who notify riders of safety hazards;

Runoff areas - no cliffs, rock walls, curbs, telephone poles, guardrails, or trees;

No on-coming traffic or dangerous cross-traffic; and

No speeding tickets.

You will not have to think about anyone using a mobile phone, applying makeup, shaving, texting, eating, or fighting with their kids or spouse while on the track.

The RCB philosophy is to provide an environment where each rider is able to achieve their individual goals, and work to become a more skilled and safer rider. This is NOT a race. RCB understands the best way to learn is in a relaxed and stress free environment where friends, not competitors, are participants.

#### **Basic Rider Requirements:**

Minimum Age: You must be 18, or a parent or guardian must be at the track to sign the required waiver.

Motorcycle License: You must have a valid driver's license with a motorcycle endorsement.

<u>Insurance</u>: RCB takes precautions to ensure that the event is safe, but cannot control everything. You ride at your own risk. RCB does not supply insurance for you or your bike.

Medical Insurance: You are required to keep proof of medical insurance coverage with you.

<u>Motorcycle Insurance & Accident Costs:</u> In the event of an accident you are fully responsible for all costs and potential liability, including any medical cost, transportation, or other costs of any kind (we can't list everything). Please be prepared, act responsibly, and take precautions for yourself and others.

Signed Waivers: When you arrive for registration, you must sign a release of liability for RCB and RFR.

#### **Proper Riding Gear:**

Common sense and RCB require proper riding gear – an undamaged DOT approved full face helmet with face shield; full leathers, or two-piece leather suit that zips together, or full zip style Cordura (nylon) one-piece (Aerostich), or two piece Cordura zip-together motorcycle suits are acceptable; above the ankle, motorcycle-specific boots; and motorcycle specific gauntlet style gloves are required. CE approved (or similar) body armor, back protector & ear plugs are strongly recommended.

#### **Bike Preparation:**

Tires and brakes should be in new or nearly new condition. There can be no evidence of coolant or oil leaks. Taping wheel weights is required, and duct tape works well. Tape over all lenses, and remove mirrors. Blue painters tape works best, and doesn't leave residue. No light should be visible, or bleed through tape. Tape over the speedometer. The reason for taping is to eliminate distractions to you and your fellow riders. By reducing distractions, you can focus on what is important!

Cost and Other Details: To be determined, but RCB hopes to keep the cost at about \$180.00 per rider, hopefully a little less. Reserve the date, and watch the RCB Forum for more details. www.rcb.org

#### **Refunds & Cancellation Policy:**

Cancellations with more than 3 week notice are entitled to 100% refund (before May26).

No credits or refunds will be issued within 14 days of the event (after June 1), but you may sell or give the day to someone else.

Any sale or transfer of your reservation must be authorized by RCB via an e-mail sent to jackklau@comcast.net at least three days prior to the event (before June 14). If not, the sale or transfer will not be honored. You or your replacement must fill out the registration form, and send it with notification via email prior to the event. The registration form and e-mail insures the registration process can run smoothly for everyone.

Weather Policy: Track expectations are that we ride rain or shine. We'll be there ready to ride and you should be also.

#### Rules:

Participants will not use or consume any intoxicants during a track event. Alcohol and drugs impair your ability to operate a motorcycle. Family and friends are encouraged to attend events, but remember that you are responsible for your guests.

Pit speeds are limited to 5 mph.

There will be no verbal or physical confrontations. Infractions may result in being required to leave without refund.

No checks will be accepted at the track. Cash or money orders are the only options for making payments the morning of an event.

#### Rider Skills Improvement Day:

The day will begin with registration starting at about 7 AM.

After registration, each motorcycle must go through a tech. inspection. Participants either must be wearing their riding gear during the tech. inspection or show it to the inspectors.

There will be a riders meeting that covers information critical to the safety of all participants. The riders' meeting is mandatory and very important. If you do not attend the riders' meeting, you will not be allowed to ride until you can be given the day's details by an instructor. Keep in mind, if the instructors are working, you will be waiting in the pits until we have time to go over all the information with you. This if for your safety and the safety of your fellow riders.

Crash Policy: This is NOT a race. You are encouraged to break bad habits and learn new skills, but every rider should ride within their Common sense dictates that no general level of competence. In the rider may endanger life or limb or unlikely event a rider goes down, there is no guarantee that you will be permitted back on the track after a crash. If you are cleared by on-site medical personnel and your bike passes an additional tech inspection, you may be allowed to rejoin after sitting out at least one full session. This missed session is

for your safety, and allows track and RCB members an opportunity to discuss the incident with you and evaluate your safe return to riding. There is no guarantee that those that crash will be permitted back on track.

#### Compliance with Safety Procedures:

Participants agree to comply with all safety procedures and RFR track staff instructions. Failure to comply with track and paddock rules will result in you being asked to leave the event without a refund.

#### On Track Safety Procedures & Regulations:

Riders may only enter the course under the express direction of the grid marshal.

There is no passing on the inside of a corner.

There will be NO STOPPING on the track at any time unless directed by RFR track officials.

Each rider must raise his/her hand when coming off pace or exiting the track.

Dangerous riding includes, but is not limited to, passing on the inside of a corner, a blatant violation of flags displayed by corner workers, using an unapproved track entrance or exit without being directed to do so by staff or track officials. Riders who act in such manner will be asked to leave the event - without exception, appeal, or refund being given.

There will be an in depth review of track entry procedures and rules Intro. Group: This is for riders during the riders' meeting.

It is your responsibility to be safe and courteous to other participants.

We insist on strict adherence to the rules and regulations as they are designed to maintain the safest possible environment. No refunds will be given to those failing to meet the requirements or follow the rules.

#### Multi-Group Format:

The event is structured to provide a comfortable separation between riders of different abilities. There will be three riding groups designated as Intro. B and A. Riders will be asked to place themselves in a group when registering. If you participated in track days in the are not sure which group you belong in, register for the less skilled - less fast group to start out. Rid-

ers will be moved (or can move) up or down, depending on the assessments of the instructors. You are not locked into a group for the day when registering.

without track experience and those preferring to develop riding skills at a more comfortable pace. A rider should already be comfortable on the street. The first Intro. group session will consist of several instructor led "sighting laps" that orient riders to the entry and exit procedures, the lay out of the track, and the corner worker stations. If it's your first track day, you must sign up for the Intro. group. Classroom instruction will take place between track sessions. More individualized on-track instruction may follow, depending upon the assessment of instructors and the desires of riders.

B-Group: This is a faster paced group comprised of experienced street riders and those who have past. Riders in this group should be comfortable with higher speeds and more consistent lines. This

group of riders are at ease with other riders passing, the meaning of flags, and track entry/exit procedures. The B group often has the widest disparity of rider skill which will be mitigated by riders moving up or down into the most appropriate group for their skill level. Classroom instruction will take place between track sessions. More individualized on-track instruction may follow, depending upon the assessment of instructors and the desires of riders.

A-Group: This group is for fast street riders and experienced track day riders. These riders exhibit and maintain very consistent lines which allows for close passing. Speeds are high and the rules are more liberal in the A group, but passing is to be executed on the outside of a turn and safely. It still is to be determined whether there will be instruction for riders in this group.

All sessions will be monitored and riders will be moved to the best group for their particular skill set.

# **GROUP IRON BUTT RIDE FOR June 8 - CALIFORNIA SADDLESORE 1000**

I have had several members express an interest in accomplishing another Iron Butt ride this year, so if I can get 10 riders signed up we can do a California Saddlesore 1000 together.

That's 1000 miles in less than 24 hours, all within the State of California. I'm looking at Saturday, June 8 as the best day to do this - it doesn't interfere with our club meeting/ride, Father's Day or our track day, and the weather should be good with a long period of daylight. I have a route planned that should have the boring sections travelled during the dark and the better parts in the daylight, and no staring into the rising or setting sun.

I would be happy to serve as the ride certifier for the group, taking care of all the paperwork, which means all you would have to do is ride and get me only two gas receipts, one at Kettleman City and one at Eureka for my certification needs.

The route will also take you across the Golden Gate Bridge in the nopay direction, which should speed up things there, and really, what would a California SS1000 be without the Golden Gate involved? The total time should be between 16 1/2 and 18 hours, depending on traffic and the amount of stops you make.

Look for a sign up list on the RCB forum coming soon. The cost should be the same as last year if

you want the certificate, license plate frame, pin and sticker - \$40 for RCB members, \$45 for non members. This ride qualifies as one you can do for your first IBA ride, so no prior IBA membership is needed. Current IBA members are encouraged to come along as you will get a special California SS1000 pin to add to your collection.

As I get closer to having the ten riders signed up I will have more details regarding the ride, specifically start/end points, route sheets, etc., so please add your name to the list on the forum so I can get this going and we can get another challenging group ride for the RCB.
