The meeting was brought to order at 7.04 by VP Mike Robles

The first order of business was that Larry Klein, our Webmaster has a blood clot that will not allow him to perform his duties as Webmaster for a while. Bob suggested that we hire a professional to do it for a while until we can ascertain whether or not Larry will be able to resume his work on the website. Carl has a friend that has the skills to do it and if we couldn't find a replacement he would ask his friend to fill in. Carl's friend, Jeff Whitford may fill in temporarily. Ray Nugit mentioned that if the website is ready, it would be fairly simple to get Wild Apricot going. Apparently some of the features apparently won't transfer to the new Wild Apricot. Carl mentioned and it was agreed that the website is vital to attract new members. Membership maybe required to acquire the ride route downloads and other information found on the website.
