## Beemer Bingo 2024 Mileage Contest

Starting April 1, this year's contest consists of visiting sites on the bingo card and getting a picture of your bike at the sign for each site. Everyone gets the exact same 6 x 6 bingo card, and each bingo will have a certain number of raffle tickets assigned to it, a minimum of one and a maximum of twelve. There are only 81 tickets available in total, so a single ticket has more value this year. All the locations are within the state of California except two, which are in Nevada. There are free spaces on each line (except one diagonal) so you can get most bingos with only five sites visited on each. As you send your pictures to me, either by email (frebeck94@gmail.com) or my phone (916 230 0951), I will check off the spot on your bingo card and alert you when you have scored a bingo. Continue collecting sites and scoring bingos until September 15. The raffle will be held once again at our Manchester Beach event in October, and you must be present to win the set of tires mounted on your motorcycle. The bingo card will be unveiled on the RCB website on March 31, and physical bingo cards will be distributed at the April club meeting for those who don't know how to hit the print button on their computer. ## Rider Skills Improvement Day

We are contemplating joining Fun Track Dayz for a day of instruction at Thunderhill, East Track on Monday, April 15, 2023.

If you are anxious about a track day and this would be your first time on a track, I'll share a real story. My daughter decided to take the MSF Basic Rider Course. You know, the one that is part classroom and part basic riding in a parking lot to get a motorcycle driver's license endorsement. She completed her MSF course two weeks before we, interested RCB members, signed up with Fun Track Dayz a few years ago. My daughter had no street riding experience as a rider. I signed her up for the track day and she rode my GS without any prior experience riding my GS. Despite what you may think, a track is the safest place to learn new riding skills, practice those skills and break bad habits. My daughter had a blast and learned more about riding a motorcycle in one day than she likely would have after years of street riding. As her father, I knew she would develop skills in the safest environment possible that might save her life if she pursued street riding. Below is the proof.





Many of us have extended rides planned around the MOA Rally in Redmond and a track day will be a great opportunity to "get in shape." For me, that is a primary motivation.

Fun Track Dayz was created by Augie Weber Sr in 2005 with the mission to provide safe and fun track days for riders of all skill levels from novice to experts. Fun Track Dayz focuses on bringing street riders to the track to educate and teach riders the necessary skills to be smooth, consistent, safe, and predictable both on the track and on the street.

Most of us will sign up for the Novice Group although you are welcome to sign up for Intermediate or Expert if you have a suitable bike aka sportbike and have the chops to ride that bike at the lap times posted on the Fun Track Dayz web site. I most certainly do not.

Fun Track Dayz is willing to provide RCB members a \$30 per person discount if we sign up ten riders or more in the Novice Group. For reference, that is close to its cost per rider.

If you are ready to sign up, please contact me. Fun Track Dayz asked me to handle the initial sign-up process and collection of fees. The earlier you sign up the better. Once we have ten committed riders (committed means paid the \$170.00 fee) I will sign folks up with Fun Track Dayz and transmit the money.

Once signed up with Fun Track Dayz you must follow the Fun Track Dayz cancellation / refund policy.

If we do not get ten the fee is \$200.00 per person.


