

The Turn

I've told the story hundreds of times. This is the first time writing it out.

I worked at one of the States largest BMW shops for 9 + years - A&S BMW. A&S is located next to the freeway (I 80). West to SF. East to Lake Tahoe. A&S is near a stop light-controlled intersection off the on ramp to the freeway.

The road to the motorcycle shop runs next to the freeway. At the stop light to the "Turn" there's a right hander that runs up and on to the freeway sporting a Beautiful "two" lane swooping-right hand uphill that sports a nice On Camber turn." It's a Turn that begs to sling shot around. I have been eyeballing this Turn for years waiting for the right time to attack it. With its beautiful arc pairing up to another right lane to enter the over-pass freeway exit.

Now this surface road and stop light are always working Hard, alot of traffic and a quick light that leans to the more traffic side. Meaning it's always busy.

This Friday at 5;30pm signaling days end I am off, starter button pushed with a following roar from the Guzzi. I turn left on the surface street and, for the first time I had a clear path to the intersection and the light was "GREEN".

That day I had my Moto Guzzi Californian. This bike had a Tonti frame. Doctor Tonti built frames for racing for MG in the day. I had a raised frame model. I changed



suspension to Penske's, at the time a good choice and modified valving on the forks. It handled nice for a cruiser with clearance.

Ok, I am rolling down the road and see the green light/no traffic I think if not now when? Let's bury this Turn.

Did I mention I lost my lower right leg 7 years ago? That's another story.

The Goose has "floorboards." I Hit the turn traveling strong in 3rd gear Grabbing at more speed. I'm in the turn starting to drift out some. Damn, I'm going to "Fast." I counter steer and press hard on right bar and floorboard, still going too fast, Iam now drifting wide into the next lane. I press and step a final time and then hear a terrible aluminum tearing sound, glancing to my right I see my right lower leg flying over my right shoulder, "F ME my leg is gone, I don't crash, I make it to the right side of the overpass and am able to kill the bike, with quick thinking I kick out the side stand with my left leg and slide off the bike holding on to the Guzzi Bars with my pant leg Blowing in the wind.

My "leg" is laying in the middle of the intersection unnaturally. Traffic is abundant, cars are coming up the overpass hill driving around the leg as it was nuclear waste, on both sides wide berths are made. Me trying to wave down a little sympathy while pant leg is blowing in the wind.

The Lights do a full cycle in all directions, still no help. I pull my phone out to call the shop to get help to save my leg. Traffic light does a full cycle like I said and now the lead head car at the Red stop light has seated a pair of young girls. A "20" something young lady kicks open the passenger door with heels a flying, followed by a short black dress. She scoops up my leg then hugs it to her breasts and comes running up the offramp with amazing "heel speed."

At this point everyone's watching her with my leg from all 4 corners. Guys yelling "Right ON" out their windows and everyone starts "Honking" like crazy. She hands me my leg back and I square up to hug her. She runs back to her car, the light changes and everything goes back to normal. I limp home on the Guzzi thinking

Fall Classic Manchester Beach


Like many of you we look forward to this event each year. It is the one time each year I know Lynell will ride with me. We were accompanied by Steve and Jenny Harris.

The weather Thursday was fantastic. Locals were complaining loudly about the heat. We luxuriated in the cool coastal breeze.















We had an easy ride to the KOA Friday on Hwy 1.


