From the newsletter editor's desk



If you lived in England you'd be pretty lucky! How you ask? Well I'll tell you. In the January 2005 issue of "Bike" magazine there's a two page add about the "Long Way Round" and your chance to buy a DVD or CD soundtrack or both of the documentary. I'm glad I don't live in the UK, however, because their prices are outrageous! DVD is \$35.71, the CD soundtrack is \$28.20 or the combo deal sets you back \$54.61. I'll wait until Amazon.com in the good 'ole USA starts selling it. One thing that does make living in the UK sound appealing is the chance to win a BMW GS Adventure just like Ewan and Charley's. That might make paying the super outrageous taxes slightly worth it.

According to "Bike" magazine there's an impending motorcycle recession in the works that will last throughout 2005. They're warning their readers who have their bikes for sale on consignment to pull them and take them home as soon as possible. Their reasoning is if the dealer goes "tits-up" it will be extremely difficult to get their bike back from the receiver. "Bike" magazine predicts that new bike prices will fall at never before seen low prices just so the dealership can stay above water. I wonder how USA BMW sales will be in 2005 with the upcoming R1200RT with the looks "only a mother could love"?

"Bike" magazine has a special feature about how the added traffic signs and speed cameras are increasing traffic accidents in the UK. Edmund Kind of the Royal Auto Club foundation spells it out: "Drivers and riders hesitate for a second or two while they try to take in this sea of information. A second or two of lapsed concentration on the road is enough for an accident to occur. It's not rocket science." Paul Smith of a cam-

paign group called Safe Speed says that people ask why aren't cameras out side school zones. Paul says that on present evidence that's the last place one wants a camera. "We need drivers looking out for kids-not staring at their speedos." Let's hope Sacramento doesn't go nuts with their red light cameras.

According to "Bike" magazine the BMW R850R is a bland and wheezy motorbike. Spend the extra money and get the R1150R bike, it's hugely more interesting. I took their advice and bought a used R1150R and it is a blast to ride!

Tokyo, a city of almost 30 million people, is a place where motorcycles reign supreme. Not the mega-cruisers or the luxotourers that we proudly shine incessantly, but rather compact small displacement workhorses; scooters with strange names like Majesty, Sky Wave, Fusion, Address, and the good old-fashioned Passport motorbike with practical racks for carrying everything from legal documents to fish.

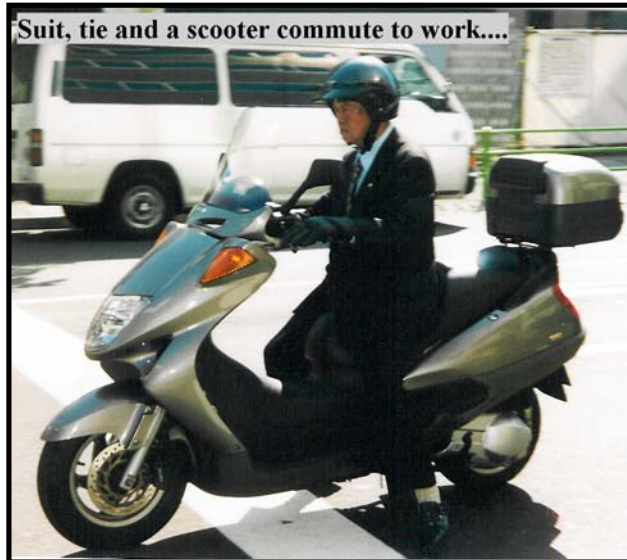
In Tokyo the traffic moves at a frenetic pace. Small efficient cars with steering wheels on the "wrong" side scurry along on the "wrong" side of the road. Never is there a honked horn, an impolite word, and never-ever is there an obscene gesture. Drivers speed up. They slow. They merge. Drivers respect one another. They allow for one another. Collectively, they perform what amounts to an urban ballet.

In the midst of these untold different autos, miniature trucks and tiny vans are millions of motorcycles, scooters, and motorbikes splitting lanes. They seem to get "there", wherever "there" may be, faster and more efficiently than cars. Straddling this array of two-wheelers, most no larger than 400 cc, in the rain and shine are neck-tied office workers, deliverymen, messengers, shoppers, and fishermen.

Of fish, I ate plenty: sashimi (raw fish), sushi (raw fish dolloped over rice), tempura (batter dipped and fried), lots of steamed rice, and a variety of other vegetables and fruits that were completely new to my taste buds. Every meal became an adventure, especially when you can't speak the language.

The best of the best was found at the working waterfront, the Tsujiki, the biggest fish market in the entire world. There, every conceivable specie of sea creature is unloaded from trawlers and processed for distribution into the largest fish-eating country in the world. Tuna is fresh and frozen, auctioned and filleted. Octopi are sliced and diced. Flounder still swim in salt-water holding tanks, awaiting their contribution to the world. The energy level is simply overwhelming and it appears that it will not subside. The entire market, systematically bustling with its people and their fish, suggests that its well-oiled activity is the result of centuries of evolution.

Where else, but among these working Japanese fish mongers would I enjoy the finest sashimi in the entire world? It wasn't fancy, but it was respectfully served on a bed of seaweed, offered politely with miso (a Japanese soup), sticky white rice, and green tea. It was a workman's breakfast of especial honor



and quality, served by grateful hardworking culinaries. The experience was the epitome of sharing the culture of the Japanese people, who are gracious, polite and courteous beyond limits.

In the heart of this working waterfront on the edge of Tokyo Bay, the motorcycle, in all its variations and gritty glory, also reigned supreme. They carried the fishmongers and their wares.

It's hard to tell at what point in the spectrum of time that U.S. streets and cities will become so congested that a "modal shift"

will occur, and the role of the motorcycle will become more important. Perhaps, it's when our cities outgrow their infrastructure. Perhaps it's when gasoline rises to \$4 per gallon. Whatever the driving force, the shift is clearly occurring in Tokyo. By default, if nothing else, life appears farther along on the timeline.

When our large urban cities get there in the future (and they will), I hope I can still lift my leg over a saddle and ride on. Of things to come there is the motorcycle and sushi.
