The President's Corner by Gary Stofer



Welcome to the heat of a summer in Sacramento. As I sit putting this column together this month the TV weather lady predicts a high temperature of 104 degrees. Fortunately, we have an RCB event this weekend at Indian Creek Reservoir where there should be some relief from the high temperatures of the valley. In addition, all of the Sierra passes are finally open. There's nothing like a ride at 9,000 foot elevation to cool you off. If I remember correctly from one of the classes I stayed awake in back in my school days, it's 3 ½ degrees cooler for every 1000 ft. increase in elevation. A little counting on the fingers and toes calculates the temperature on Sonora pass to be about 73 degrees. Sounds good to me.

Speaking of counting on fingers and toes, we had quite a turn-out for the Chief Joseph rally last weekend at John Day, Oregon. 11 riders left from Sacramento on Thursday prior to the rally and 9 left from the gas stop in Quincy later that morning. It was either an organizational lapse or the counting thing that left 2 riders waiting in line for a nature call. No real harm done as we all found our way to Lakeview that night where 15 of us enjoyed a great Mexican dinner next door to the motel. See? None of these figures add up. I'm so confused. And at John Day there were probably 30 RCB'ers arriving from various destinations. The weather was just about perfect and I didn't see a single mosquito. Of course, why would you from inside your cement tent at the Dreamers Lodge?

Items of interest: 1st, if you are riding in a group and keeping track of motorcycles behind you, it becomes obvious that riders using driving lights or high beams or modulating headlights are very conspicuous. Those using just the low beam are pretty much invisible. You might think about this when you're riding alone. 2nd, if you are riding when it's hot, remember to replenish the fluids in your body. I use a Camelbak system to stay hydrated, but anything that keeps water accessible while riding will work. You'd be amazed at how better you feel at the end of a long day. 3rd, if you ride the mighty oilhead GS and the only dirt the tires ever see is in your own driveway, there's good news regarding tire selection. Michelin now makes the Pilot Road tire in sizes to fit the GS. Motorcycle Consumer News tested them and reported that they are great on the pavement. They run straight and quiet, grip well in the turns. Predictably, they're no so hot for the dirt. That sounds good to me.

In closing, don't forget all the great ride destinations for July. You can start with the BMW RA national rally in Boise, Idaho on the 2nd weekend of July, then to the Top O' the Rockies in Paonia, Colorado on the 3rd weekend, and finish off the tri-fecta with the BMW MOA national rally in Essex Junction, Vermont on the 4th weekend. Above all, make sure that you:

Get Lost!

The British 'Ride' magazine's May 2006 issue had a more refined way it gave directions than the original multi GPS face off with some surprising results.

6th place was the BMW Navigator II. It's biggest problem was the occasional loss of Satellite reception which no other gps did during the test.

5th place was the Garmin 2610 street pilot. It's similar to the Navigator II and it also lost reception several times.

4th place was the Tom Tom Rider. The display in direct sunlight was a bit difficult, but very easy to program a route.

3rd place was the Garmin Quest. The compact size made it easier to fit on more motorcycles.

2nd place was the Garmin Quest II. Bike liked the

Quest.

1st place was the Garmin 2720. It processes information faster than the 2610 and the screen is easy to see in direct sunlight. More user friendly than the 2610 and it never lost Satellite reception. The 2720 also speaks out the name of the road that you will turn at. This makes it unnecessary to have to look at the screen to see the name of the street. Very helpful while riding a motorcycle. The future BMW Navigator III will be based on the Garmin 2720.

From the "World of BMW News" May 2006

Carl Fogarty is one of the most famous names in motor-cycle racing and a legend among the fans that followed his World Superbike career. But when he decided to ride across New Zealand there was only one choice of bike to use - BMW's all-conquering GS.

The name of Carl Fogarty stands out as one of the most successful motorcycle racers of modern times. His four World Superbike Championships and 59 race victories, along with TT wins and F1 titles are testament to the man's ability to race a motorcycle faster and with more controlled aggression than anyone else. Who knows what he might have achieved had it not been for the freak crash and career-ending shoulder injury he sustained while riding a works Ducati at Philip Island in Australia in 2000.

When it came to riding across New Zealand however, he turned to BMW to supply him with a suitable bike. A production company approached him and his wife Michaela about doing a trip to New Zealand and turning it into a TV series, DVD, to be released in October.

"I've been offered loads of stuff over the years since I retired from racing," said Carl. "I've been asked to retrace Che Guevara's steps and ride along Route 66 but when the production company mentioned New Zealand - and that it would involve both of us - I was very interested."

New Zealand is a country that has always appealed to Carl so they jumped at the chance to ride across both islands. Obviously one of the first questions was what bikes they would be taking on the journey. "I was quite happy when they said we could ride BMWs, and they were definitely the best bikes for the trip," confirmed Carl.

While Carl has been around bikes since he was a child (his dad George was a racer) Michaela had hardly ridden since passing her test seven years ago, so riding across New Zealand was going to be a big challenge. "I just wanted a bike that was easy to ride and comfortable," she explained. "The F650 GS definitely had both of those qualities in abundance. I really loved the bike."

The R1200 GS that Carl was riding turned out to be a pleasant surprise for the former factory rider who spent his career riding lightweight 210 hp race machinery capable of speeds up to 320 km/h. Prior to trying BMW's goanywhere machine, he had expected it to be heavy (his factory race bikes only weighed approximately 160 kg) but what he rapidly found was the opposite. "Once we were on our way I found it to be a great bike. It handles well, has a strong, torquey engine and is really comfy. In fact, for what we were doing they were probably the best bikes we could have had."

The pair covered on average up to 300 km each day and never had a problem. In between all this riding they still found time to enjoy some of New Zealand's challenges, including extreme sports, learning to surf, ski diving and camping under the stars. Despite having visited and holidayed in many countries, New Zealand certainly made a great impression on Carl: "We live in a small country [the UK] with 60 million people and New Zealand is the same size but with only about four million people and their roads are perfect for biking because they are so quiet. By the end of the trip we were really sad to see the BMWs go."

So, while Carl may have made his name on exotic Italian race machinery, the Fogartys have quite obviously now seen the light. So if you see someone with a 'Foggy' replica helmet riding a BMW give him a wave. You never know, it might actually be the great man himself.
