The President's Corner by Fred Jewell



Could this be the best time ever to be riding motorcycles? And I don't mean the time of year but at this particular era in history. I feel that the increased interest in motorcycling over the past couple of decades has been in all of our best interests as motorcyclists. There is a wider variety of brands and styles of motorcycles that appeal to more people in more different ways than ever before, and I firmly believe that is good for our chosen sport. More people involved in it means (hopefully) more people see us as we are: contributing members of our society that deserve respect both on and off the road, not a fringe "outlaw" segment that is looked upon with scorn or dread (despite what the marketing of a certain American manufacturer implies). This increased interest has brought with it tremendous improvements in safety, reliability, comfort, and competence in our bikes along with a huge choice of clothing and accessories available. I see better tires, brakes, lighting (I remember, and not fondly, riding a '66 Bonneville after dark when I was young), and the aftermarket is amazing in what's out there for us. There is no longer a "one size fits all" motorcycle being your only choice, but more specialized categories are offered that fit whatever you could want in a motorcycle. There are classes available just about anywhere, any

time, to teach riding skills to everyone from racers to experienced riders to raw beginners, anyone looking to improve their techniques. I wish I had these available to me when I started; my instruction consisted of "Here's the clutch, here's the brake, here's the shifter, make sure you lean in the turns". I am still trying to unlearn bad habits developed over the last 36 years. I know there is a faction of riders out there that think that the old days were the best; when a bike was two wheels and an engine and you threw a sleeping bag on it and just rode it, fixed it on the side of the road, etc., but was it really that good? Isn't it better to have tires that last over 10,000 miles, ABS brakes, heated clothing, halogen lights and reliable engines? When was it ever better than right now to be a motorcyclist?

It was brought to my attention that we might want to announce where the monthly club ride will be going ahead of time instead of just at the monthly meeting. Some of our members do not live close by and want to know the ride location in advance in order to make a decision on attending, and I thought it sounded like a good idea; I'm going to try to do that when I can. So therefore, the ride for February is the ride we had planned for January but cancelled due to the storm damage and excessive schmutz on the roads. We will be going by way of Scott Road, Latrobe Road, Buena Vista Road and around Comanche Lake to the Waterloo Inn in Waterloo (near Stockton), all excellent roads and a great place to eat (or so I'm told, I haven't been there yet). So plan accordingly, and I will try to keep up the ride announcements in this column. Check the calendar and notice that some rides will be going to that month's event, i.e. Yerington and Manchester Beach. There may also be several rides that will correspond with the monthly destinations in the Ride to Nowhere Tour that starts on April 1.

The Route 36 ride to Eureka this year has moved and is now going to be March 28 - 30. There will be a jazz festival happening in Eureka that weekend that could provide some evening entertainment for those who enjoy such things. Early reservations at the motel of your choice are recommended. Additional de-

tails will be coming up in next month's newsletter. Plan now to come along and ride the best motorcycle road in California, and I promise it won't be 108 degrees out this time.

Remember, we're not bikers, we're motorcyclists.

This way we can be sure to have plenty of beverages (sodas, water, and beer) to go around. And of course the very fine china (paper plates and plastic utensils).


Superbowl Party (and tech session???)

BMW announces lowered suspension options on six models

BMW Motorrad has announced great news for motorcyclists who would prefer a lower seat height but do not want to compromise on model choice. In 2008, BMW Motorrad will again be leading the industry by offering almost a third of its range of motorcycles with optional lowered suspension.

BMW Motorrad has listened to the requests of novices, and shorter riders, who may otherwise struggle with higher seat heights when riding at slow speeds or in stop-start conditions. In these circumstances most motorcyclists prefer to be able to place both feet

firmly on the ground and the new lower seat versions will ensure that more riders are able to reach the floor more comfortably.

The move will also appeal to a number of female riders, some of whom will appreciate this opportunity to own a high performance BMW motorcycle that previously, because of its 'standard' seat height, may not have been a realistic option.

With lowered suspension options offered on six models, including motorcycles in BMW Motorrad's Sport, Urban, Enduro, and Touring ranges, it is the variety of models offering lower seat options that sets BMW Motorrad ahead of the competition.

While a lower seat option is already an existing choice for most BMW motorcycles, six models will also be available with lowered suspension, as a factory-fitted option, to offer seat heights that are in some cases over 3 inches (or 80 mm) lower than the standard model. For example, the lowered suspension option, which is already available for the F 800 S and ST, lowers the seat height from the standard 840 mm to 760 mm.

From spring 2008 the following models will also be available to order with lowered suspension, in addition to their lower seat option: the naked R 1200 R, the best selling tourer R 1200 RT and the brand new F 650 GS and R 1200 GS Enduros.

<u>Rider</u> magazine from the UK has a yearly reader survey and BMW did rather well in several categories. World of BMW explains...

The BMW Motorrad R1200 RT has been crowned the UK's number one motorcycle by readers of RiDE magazine in its annual RiDER POWER Survey - the fourth time a BMW motorcycle has won this coveted title in the survey's eight year history.

The R1200 RT was awarded the accolade after RiDE readers were invited to nominate and assess their favourite bike according to a number of rating categories. These included build quality, engine performance, rider comfort, reliability, handling and overall impressions. The RT - which also won the 2005 MCN Best Tourer Award in its first year of production - received an overall score of 85.14 per cent, beating 149 other motorcycles to the number one spot.

Over 10,000 readers voted in the survey and each was asked to justify their choice of bike. "Overall this is a brilliant bike - I haven't had so much fun in ages" said one RT owner. A second writes: "I've had no faults, build quality or reliability issues. I'm extremely impressed with my BMW." Another claims that his RT is "the best bike I've ever owned".

The R1200 RT is not the only BMW model to appear in the countdown. The top ten alone features four BMWs, including the 2005 MCN Award-Winning K1200 S, which comes in at number five with an overall score of 82.05 per cent. BMW's sportiest-ever bike receives ample praise for its "excellent handling", "fantastic performance" and "total reliability". Eleven other BMW models were featured in the countdown.

BMW Motorrad did not only excel in the Best Motorcycle section. When asked the question "if money was no object, what bike would you buy?" a large

number of those surveyed chose the BMW R1200 GS as the motorcycle they lust after, making the 2005 award-winning all-rounder the second most popular "dream bike".

In the 'Your Favorite Dealer' section, BMW Motor-rad scored a triple victory. Ocean BMW in Plymouth, CW Motorcycles in Dorchester and Rainbow Motorcycles in Rotherham being placed in first, second and third position respectively in the Best Dealer in the UK section. Ocean and CW also came top of their regional categories. Readers cite the courteous and friendly staff, excellent service and a wide range of BMW accessories as reasons for voting these BMW Motorrad Dealerships as the best in the country.

When it comes to protective clothing, BMW Rider Equipment came top in the both the Best Leather Jacket and Best leather Jeans categories - receiving votes for comfort, protection, style and waterproofing. The BMW SportIntegral helmet was awarded first place in the Best for Silence category and came 12th out of 66 products in the Best Helmet category. BMW Motorrad also scored a number five rating in the Best Glove section.
