RCB Annual Scavenger Hunt Rules and Regulations

The Scavenger Hunt is open to RCB members only. There is no charge to enter the contest.

The Scavenger Hunt will be made up of three events - May, July, and September. You may choose one, two or all three to compete in.

There will be 3 prizes awarded in each of the three events, and a grand prize of a set of tires is being generously donated by A&S to the overall winner.

The May event will be a timed event of 6 hours to collect as many point locations as possible (while observing all rules of the road) proving with a photo of the desired destination as described in the list. A log book will also be provided to record all locations visited, it will be turned in at the 6 hour time limit to the administrator. The Hunt will begin at 9:00 AM from Susie's and will conclude at 3:00 PM at the A&S parking lot. There will be a grace period of 15 minutes after 3:00 PM, however, if you arrive after 3:15, you will have 10% of your points deduct-

ed. Should you arrive after 3:30, you will have 25% of your points deducted, and if you arrive after 4:00 you will not earn any points. Photographs should be emailed to the administrator within two weeks of the conclusion of the event and must match the log book.

The July and September events will be month-long "challenges" to visit as many of certain locations, TBA just before the month begins. A photo will be required again to prove visiting the sites. Photos should be emailed to the administrator within 2 weeks of the conclusion of each event.

This is not a contest of speed, and no consent is implied for contestants to violate any vehicle codes while participating. The administrator will also act as the sole judge in deciding validity of photos and their point values.

The main emphasis will be how does a rider get through a tough spot without breaking themselves or the bike. The goal will be to give you more confidence off the beaten path.

Directions to the lunch area will also be provided to street riders, in case they would like to join the dirt riders for lunch.

RCB Message Board Shortcuts

Response to the new RCB message board has been overwhelmingly positive. Many users have explored (or stumbled) around and found all sorts of shortcuts and tips. If you haven't had the time to explore (or stumble) around just yet, then this article is for you.

First - A caveat - The message board uses cookies, small bits of information placed on your computer to monitor your visit. Through the use of cookies, the message board knows how to identify which posts are yours, which ones you're read, and so on. So obviously, for any of these shortcuts to work, you MUST be logged in.

If you only check the message board infrequently, hunting for the unread messages can be an intimidating task of click and back, click and back, and so on. Fortunately, relatively near the center of the screen is a View New

Posts link (Fig. 1) - Click on it and the next screen will reveal any new posts since the last time you logged in. It's that simple. Every time you log in, click on View New Posts and you'll save yourself a lot of time looking for new messages.

Shortcut #2 - Getting automated notifications of new posts You probably already know that the message board default is to email you a notification anytime someone responds to one of your posts. If you didn't know that, you've probably never posted. But actually, the message board only notifies you ONCE that someone has responded to your note. After that, the message board goes quiet and stops notifying you until you log in again.

The reason for the single notification is spam related - Ask any professional webmaster and he/she will take a long breath, sigh heavily and reluctantly agree it makes sense.

Anyway, in addition to getting notified about people responding to your posts, you can also receive notifications for all posts. In other words, you could subscribe to the

RCB Rides and Destinations forum and automatically receive a notification every time someone posts a new ride!

To subscribe to a forum, click on the forum you're interested in, like the RCB Rides and Destinations forum, scroll to the bottom of the page, press the Subscribe Forum link. (Fig. 2)

Similar to individual post notifications, the message board will only send one notification and then stop until you've logged in to read the mew message. Then it will start the notifications again. Do I sound like a broken record?

Shortcut #3 - How many subscriptions do I have?!?! Let's see, you've posted three posts and subscribed to two forums - I'm guessing you have five subscriptions and you could receive up to five emails without ever logging in again. But if you want to know for sure, click on the User Control Panel, then Overview and finally Manage Subscriptions.

Depending on your level of activity, this could be a very long page.

Want to unsubscribe? Click the Mark box for any forum or message topics you want to unsubscribe from. Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on the Unwatch Marked button. Voila, you're unsubscribed! There's another way to unsubscribe from forums. Similar to shortcut #2, return to the forum you no longer want to hear from and scroll to the bottom of the page. The link that used to say Subscribe Forum now says Unsubscribe

Forum. Click it and you're unsubscribed from that forum.

Shortcut #4 - What does Delete all board cookies do? This isn't really a shortcut, but essentially, it resets you. There's a more formal explanation in the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) that states in part: Delete all board cookies deletes the cookies created by the message board which keep you authenticated and logged into the board. It also tracks any messages you may have read. If you are having login or logout problems, deleting board cookies may help.

It's no big deal. Worst case you may have to type your password to log in next time.

Shortcut #5 - Alternative Menu System

OK, this really isn't a shortcut either, just an alternative way to view the message board. What it does is place a menu area, similar to the RCB website menu, to the left of the message board. The menu area makes it easy to navigate back and forth between the website and the forum. Want to read messages about the next ride and then jump over to the website to download the Garmin file? Then this is for you.

Click on User Control Panel, then Board Preferences. About halfway down the page is a selector box labeled My board style: and currently showing prosilver. Change is to RCBMenu and click on Submit. After the screen refreshes, a menu, similar to the one on the RCB website, will appear on the left. (Fig. 3)

Again, some caveats. Since this style makes the screen wider, you really don't want to use this alternative unless your screen is XGA or above (1024 or more pixels wide). It'll work with less than XGA but it may be painful having to scroll left and right to read all the posts. That's it for now - If you haven't yet, go ahead and poke around the message board. Any questions? Post them in RCB Help Forum and someone will get back to you!
