Where Has Greg Been?

He's been really quiet on the computer lately. For good reasons. A lap top would not have been very happy in my Jessie bags and Mexico just does not have very many wi fi coffee shops. For a little over 2 years I have been planning a Baja motorcycle trip with fellow ex-work mate Ehren Dreisbach. Ehren & I along with 2 other CHP motor Officers Mark Slater and Rick Murry finally made the extraordinary trip. On 1-1-09 at 1830 hours the already loaded suburban & trailer picked me up for our trek. Everyone but me had installed knobby tires. This

made the trailer a necessary evil down to Ricks Aunt & Uncle's house in Riverside. We had also planned to drive in shifts all night to save time. When we got back to Riverside on the 14th, those knobbies were all bald. We experienced over 3,000 miles of the best roads and back dirt roads Baja Mexico has to offer.

To avoid the banditos we crossed the border at Tecate, a lesser used crossing. Once to Ensenada, we took Hwy. 1 most of the way down to our Grand Mayan time share in San Jose Del Cabo. It took 4 days with a minor deviation. First two days it rained. Below the Bay of Concepcion & Mulege (Moo le hey) we turned due west. This dirt/rock/cinder/sand/gravel (all of the above), approx. 40 mile road took us to San Isidro (Is-he-dro). A beautiful oasis in the middle of nowhere. Stunning views, canyons, mountain vistas, water ways, palm trees, cattle and horses crossing suddenly from concealed brush were the norm. Three times the road turned to river rocks. One The trip up to San Felipe took all day and not just



section the rocks were the size of helmets. Hang on dude this could be a bumpy ride. You could see where the punctures of car oil pans had occurred. We passed stripped/burned out rusting car hulks on the roadside. I saw no abandoned BMW motorcycles. This was a good sign for

While at the San Jose Del Cabo condo we went on day excursions of the lower tip of Baja. Cabo San Lucas (25 miles south) has a BMW dealer. Very little English is spoken and I have stories to tell! On the way back we did the Gonzaga Bay dirt road loop that takes you in at Chapala Junction from be-

low San Felipe. Had to check out Coco,s Corner. Just friendly, lonely cats occupy the sparse sheds and abandoned campers that sit on the ground now. Mr. Coco is gone to the hospital. A very sick diabetic, most likely not to return. It had been 31 years since I had been to the Punta Final/Gonzaga Bay area. Alfonso's Hotel was still there, unchanged. The atmosphere, beach and fresh out of the bay sea food was simply outstanding. Accommodations are not for the weak of heart. But neither is the road in. There is an 8 mile straight as an arrow stretch of sand just south of the Pemex station. The guys let me go first so they could stop to pick me back up. I took off in 3rd gear, kept it at 30 to 35 mph and was later told that no one could keep up with me. I never looked back, believe me I didn't have the time too!!! I was glad to have that behind me. Would I do it again? Ask me in person sometime.

because the dirt road seems to go on forever. Its wash board, sand, gravel and rock all at once. The views of the ocean are worth the back pain that I still have from that road. With no gas at the Pemex in Gonzaga Bay, two bikes ran out of fuel. My tank was too low to get a hose into the gas. An attempt to remove gas from Ehrens GS using the cross over connection failed big time. The connector broke and would not refasten. An old generator fuel line tube used as decoration at Cowpatty (hot dog stand) was borrowed to replace the connector. It worked, but Ehren lost about 2 gallons of gas during the operation. Within a few miles everyone but the big Adventure bike came to a grinding halt. Rick's KTM started out toward San Felipe with me but disappeared shortly. He has a wild story of how he walked to a farm house to buy some gas. I continued the 35 miles into San Felipe and came back with the new bike name of "Supertanker GS". 8.5 gallons can be handy on a motorad in Mexico.

We rode over 3,000 miles, experiencing a large range of surface variations on and off road. We had high gusty winds, slick mud from rain, sand, gravel and rocks. We encountered extreme roadway conditions, wide trucks and trailers on the 9 foot wide lanes, livestock anytime, anyplace and just plain bad drivers. Most of them had California plates. It is a real credit to the CHP motor training program that our bikes kept the rubber side down and shinny side up. Oh, I guess some of it could also be attributed to riding skill. What's next for the Adventure bike. Lance Armstrong and the 2009 Amgen Tour of California bike race in February. Supertanker GS is in the shop for new tires, a full service and a new rear shock. The bike is simply an amazing piece of machinery. This retirement stuff is rough. That's my story and I'm stickin' to it!
