

Ride To Morro Bay in April

It's not too early to start planning for our first club weekend overnight ride (OK, 2nd after Greg's B&B ride) coming up April 16 - 18.

We will be leaving from the 49er Truck stop at I-80 and El Camino at 9:00 AM that Friday, heading down I-5 to Santa Nella, the Pacheco Pass and lunch in Monterey at the Wild Thyme Deli. After that it is straight down route 1 to Morro Bay. A route sheet is coming from Ride Leader Ken so look for it soon on our website.

The motel of choice is the Morro Crest Inn; call Danny at 805 550 6960 to reserve a room at \$68 for two beds and \$55 for one. There are many more choices in town if you wish other accommodations; most are within walking distance of the Morro Crest and the Embarcadero (dining/shops) area. Saturday can be spent in many ways: relaxing or shopping in Morro Bay, riding route 58 to McKittrick and back, exploring San Luis Obispo or visiting Hearst Castle in San Simeon.

We will be having a group dinner both Friday and Saturday nights at one of the restaurants along the Embarcadero, most likely the Harbor Hut and the Flying Dutchman. If you can't join us on Friday there is no reason you can't come down Saturday and meet us for dinner and the ride home.

There will be a group ride back to Sacramento on Sunday for those who wish to ride together, and it will involve riding east on route 58 (an extraordinary road!), then north to Coalinga to 198 west (another extraordinary road!) and north on 25 to Hollister (even another extraordinary road!), Pacheco Pass once more and then I-5 home. Thunderhill 2010 - One More Time With Gusto

RCB's annual Rider Skills Improvement Day is on schedule for Sunday, August 29, 2010, but for a while it looked like the record of 14 consecutive Thunderhill events would come to an end. How it happened is an interesting story.

Late last year, Thunderhill's parent company needed our Sunday for their event. The folks at Thunderhill offered us weekdays, but we respectfully declined fearing that attendance would be below break-even. An announcement was made in our newsletter and Saturday meetings that there would be no Thunderhill



2010!

Meanwhile, the "never say die" group started looking at alternatives – The nearby tracks in Fernley, at Laguna Seca and Infineon were contacted. Even distant Buttonwillow was considered, but none had suitable weekend availability. In desperation, several commercial organizers, Keigwin's, Zoom Zoom, Track Masters and Pacific Track, were queried about cosponsoring a track day. Most were willing to offer RCB members specials, but none wanted a cosponsor.

Then, just last month, Thunderhill advised us that August 29th had opened up and if we still wanted it, it was available. The deposit went out the next afternoon.

Ironically, what started as a move of desperation (commercial co-sponsorship), turned out to be one of the best learning experiences for RCB's Thunderhill team. The difference between the commercial guys' Track Days and RCB's Rider Skills Improvement Days became crystal clear. Among the many differences:



Rider Classes – Commercial organizers (and RCB) categorize riders into A (advanced) to C (beginner) classes. Some add B+ and B- to further differentiate the intermediate riders. But what was interesting was how the commercial guys tend to shun the C riders. A quick glance at the Keigwin's calendar shows primarily A, B+ and B- events, with very C events. At Thunderhill 2009, a full 40% of our participants started as C riders ... and quite a few had moved up to B before the end of the day.

Instructors – The credentials of most commercial instructors is impressive – These are skilled sports bike racers! Yes, we have a couple racers at RCB, but the larger demographic are the street bikes, GS, GT, LT,



RS, S and RT. Our instructors are BMW riders, know how BMW riders ride, and tailor their instruction to the real needs of the average BMW rider.

The Track – Our Rider Skills Improvement Day is unique in that we split the Thunderhill track for most of the day so beginners and intermediate riders get exclusive access during their track periods. During your track time, you train and practice with similar skilled riders, not Joe Racer practicing his skills and inadvertently cutting you off.

Amenities – From your arrival Saturday afternoon until your departure Sunday afternoon, pretty much everything except fuel is taken care of. There's a track walk, plenty of track personnel to advise, and a host of RCB volunteers to answer your questions and service your needs. All meals and refreshments are included, and there are camping and shower fa-

cilities if you want to save the cost of a Willows hotel room. Except for fuel, there are no other Thunderhill expenses.

The Price – We checked, and there's no better deal than RCB. The commercial guys start at \$220 and go up from there. And their price doesn't include meals, camping or refreshments, which run another \$15-25 at the Thunderhill deli. RCB's price is \$195 for members and 2009 participants, and \$220 for others, but that includes all food and refreshments. Our price is unmatched in Northern California!
