

In Search of the Ultimate Fish Taco!

An oldie but goody from 2003. XM radio only had one million subscribers at the time. My son is now married with two children and lives in Charleston, SC and I still live on the farm. I rode my 2002 R1150 GSA, but now I have a 2005 R1200GS and less hair and blubber.

If you're really hungry I'll save you the trouble of reading this article and tell you to go directly to Baja Fresh in Sacramento!

I just spent four days in mid August riding with my son Troy, who's a student at San Diego State, motoring 300 miles down Baja, Mexico.

If you're an XM radio fan I had good reception the entire trip. The roads are also newly paved and very smooth by Mexican standards with only four shallow pot holes near Catavina.

We stopped overnight in Ensenada, San Quintin, and Catavina. For Ensenada the fish taco was rated at 3. San Ouintin's fish taco rating was 4 and Catavina's rating was 2. Baja Fresh in Sacramento was rated 10 and Rubio's in Sacramento was rated a very close 9.

Premium gas was \$2.50 per gallon. 10.4 pesos to the dollar. You could buy everything with dollars and the stores and gas stations were giving the same 10.4 exchange rate.

I needed no tourist cards and my return across the Tecate border was very simple. I just raised my tinted face shield and stated my citizenship was USA. My wait to cross the border was 15 minutes on a Sunday at 11:45am.

If you want to ride like a Hooligan then Mexico is for you. I never locked my bike and I parked in the motel parking lot with the bike



covered. I left my tank bag and GPS and detector on the bike. No problems whatsoever!

Our Catavina La Pinta hotel's generator for the air conditioners was broken so no A/C or hot water. Our room temperature was 98F so it was difficult to sleep. The pool felt great.

Take a chance and head for Mexico, it's fun!


