

Summer is officially here, so there is no longer any seasonally-related reason to limit your riding. Put that heated vest away, dig out the mesh jacket you stuck in the back of the closet last September and get out there and ride. But seriously, folks...I just wanted to rant a little, knowing perfectly well that RCB'ers do not actually need any encouragement to ride in July (or, for that matter, in January or any other month!).

The Spring Classic definitely lived up to its name and should become a regular fixture on our annual events calendar. If you were unlucky enough to have missed this year's inaugural Classic then go to the RCB website and check out the pictures of the fun you would have had. The members of the Special Committee to Review Events With Upside Potential (the "SCREWUPS") left their lairs in Rocklin and did a magnificent job organizing this event. About seventy RCB'ers were there to enjoy the riding and the camaraderie. Hope to see even more riders in 2015!

Del Christiansen, a BMW and RawHyde offroad riding instructor, has offered prior some free (yes, I said "FREE"!) rider training to the Club. Although the training is primarily focused on off-road riding, Del assures me that a lot of the techniques are valuable on the pavement as well. The first (on-pavement) session will be in the A&S parking area on Sunday, July 27, starting at 9am. The class is limited to fifteen participants and the sign up list is on the RCB website (on the Forum). Del will also do a follow-up training session at the Prairie City facility later this summer that

will actually be off-road! I will have more on that session later.

Mike Pordes (the guy who spoke about ear protection at our last monthly meeting) has agreed to come back on a Saturday and measure interested RCB'ers for custom ear protection. Once we have decided on the exact date I will get word out to members through the RCB website and an e-mail blast. The folks at Susie's have agreed to let us hang around one Saturday after breakfast for the first "RCB Ear-Fest"! I will let everyone know once we finalize the date. It will be a Saturday in July or August (starting at about 9am after we eat and going until everyone's ears are protected). Don't worry -- this event will not conflict with either the July monthly ride (the Railroad Flat picnic) or the August monthly ride (Yerington Ride 'n' Bowl).

Even recognizing how frugal (that's a fancy word for "cheap") most RCB'ers are, I am still surprised that no one has decided to order the really cool Twisted Core base layers that are available to club members at a discount. Check the Forum for details. If you don't believe me, ask Jeannie Thurston how well they performed on her recent Iron Butt ride.

Speaking of Jeanie and the other Iron Butters (and I was just speaking of them), hearty congratulations are due to eleven (yes 11!) riders who successfully put over 1,000 miles on their bikes in under 24 hours. Ryan Moore was the first finisher in 14 hours and 15 minutes for the 1,020-mile jaunt. The final bikes came in after 16 hours and 40 minutes of saddle time. I did the math and Ryan AVERAGED 71.6mph including time for gas and (presumably) pee stops. The final finishing group averaged 61.2mph, including stops. That is some really serious riding! I was so impressed that I considered trying an Iron Butt myself. NOT TO WORRY – the feeling passed quickly as soon as I opened a cold one to restore my normal mental acuity as well as a mature recognition of my own limitations.

Finally, don't forget to make your reservations for Yerington. There's bowling in them thar hills!

- A. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM.
- B. Last Month's Minutes: The Minutes from last month were moved for approval without changes by Terry, second by Marv, motion carried.
- C. Treasurer's Report The P & L has moved toward a loss of \$593.40 for the year. May 31, 2014 Treasurers Report is attached as reference.
 - 1. Closed Events: Tech day expenses \$163.77 vs. budget of \$150.00
 - 2. Toy Run expenses of \$256.37 vs. budget of \$400.
 - 3. Poker Run expenses of \$418.17 vs. budget of \$450
 - 4. Open Events: Spring Fling at Trinity current expenses \$679.92 vs. budget of \$500. Expected total expenses to end up just under \$1100 due to additional cost of campsites and firewood.

Old Business

- 1. Trinity Alps AKA Spring Fling The new event was a huge success with somewhere over 70 attendees. Because of the larger than anticipated turnout the event was a bit of a budget buster but well worth the effort by the Rocklin RCB Gang and their organizational skills and vision was much appreciated by the group. There was some discussion that, assuming that this event could be set for the first Monday in June, that it be combined with the monthly meeting. One thing that was very helpful was the number of folks who four wheeled it bringing along needed supplies for the two wheel riders.
- 3 The June Oyster Run This ride was the June Club Ride and was a great success as well. The ride was to Samuel P. Taylor State Park in Marin County (near Point Reyes Station) with an oyster lunch stop at a local eatery. There was a circuitous, three-hour route to get there. Folks who wanted to spend the night Saturday camped at the park. RCB is reserved campsites. Those who didn't want to spend the evening returned to home after lunch.
- 4 Manchester Beach Jack Weiglein has hinted that he may be amenable to managing the Manchester Beach Saturday night dinner. Only a hint so far but progress. It was also suggested that there is a catering organization in Woodland that would prepare the food and deliver it for self service for about \$14.95 per person plus a \$100 delivery charge. We would have to provide paper plates, utensils, etc. It has been suggested that there is a non-profit Grange and perhaps other non-profits in the area that could be contacted for catering as well.
- 5 Saddle Sore 1,000 The members of the Gold Country Riders along with any RCB members and others are still planning a June 21 ride from A & S to Wendover, UT and back. Sign up on the forum if you desire to put 1,000 miles on your motorcycle in only one day.

New Business

Several members took advantage of the presentation and ordered custom fit hearing protection that day. UPCOMING CLUB EVENTS

A TOUR OF THE SOUTHWEST + PAONIA RALLY

Ken Caruthers and I have been discussing this for quite a while, how can we encourage people to go on a touring ride who may not have done one before? Granted, there are a lot of our members that have ridden across the country any number of times, but for those who are new to touring we felt it would be a good idea to set up a well organized tour, without demanding levels of miles between stops, a 'go as you please' pace, several options to bail out and head home, and an excellent destination. So, that's what we did. We came up with a ride that will cover about 350 miles per day, taking four days to get to the Top O' the Rockies Rally in Paonia, CO, and will explore some of the greatest roads and most beautiful country along the way.

We will be leaving Susie's on **Monday,** July 14 at 9:00 AM, heading up I-80 to Fernley, NV, and across Nevada on US 50 to our first stop in Eureka, NV. We'll be staying at the Eureka Inn/Best Western Plus that night.

Tuesday finds us going east and south to Panguitch, UT, staying at the Purple Sage Motel. The roads between Cedar City and Panguitch are outstanding motorcycle roads with incredible views of the Cedar Breaks National Monument.

Wednesday we'll be riding on one of the best motorcycle roads in the country - highway 12 from Panguitch to Torrey. Bryce Canyon is on this road, which should give you some idea of the scenery. After that highway 95 going to Blanding, UT, will remind you of the scenery from the roadrunner/coyote cartoons we all watched as kids, minus the falling anvils and pianos. We'll be staying at the Gateway Inn in Blanding that night.

More fantastic roads will be on tap for **Thursday**, in particular the Million Dollar Highway between Silverton and Ouray, CO, one of those roads you just have to do on a motorcycle at some time in your life; it's that outstanding. If you've come along this far, you might as well attend the rally in Paonia, a favorite of many of the RCB members.
