# **Riding Tips**

By Former RCB President and All-Around Good Guy - Gary Stofer (RIP)

#### **June 2004**

Riding tip for this month! When you're tooling along alone, or even in a group, use your mirrors. I know it's hard to imagine but sometimes people come up behind you that want to ride or drive faster than you do. As a matter of courtesy you ought to offer to share your lane with another motorcyclist, even if he's riding a sport bike or Harley. (Hey, it could happen) You could signal them that you know they're there by waving them around with your left hand. As for cars, I wouldn't recommend letting them share your lane, but you could use a turnout when one presents itself. I know I sure appreciate it when a car pulls aside to let me pass. And I always give them a full-handed wave to acknowledge the courtesy. I'm not sure how many acts of civility it takes to offset the effect of one doctor/ lawyer with straight pipes, but I'm willing to work at it. You should be, too.

Make sure to have your motorcycle in top shape for the season. Don't start off on a long trip with worn tires. You don't want strangers mounting your tires for you. Don't plan on having your oil changed on the road for the same reason. Have it done before you leave and run it a little long, if necessary. Learn how to plug and re-inflate a flat tire. Carry rain gear and put it on before you get wet. These are things I've learned over the years that make it easier to.


