RCB 40th Anniversary

As some of you may have picked up at the last two member meetings this year is RCB's 40th anniversary. Below is an introduction to the club from the web site.

The Story of the River City Beemers As related by Founding Member Earl Mattingly in June 1996.

In the late seventies and early eighties, I rode with my son and his friends, all of whom owned a variety of motorcycles: a Honda 750, a Yamaha 1100, a Suzuki 650, a Kawasaki 1000 and me on a BMW R100/7. We rode mostly on day trips with an occasional overnight camp-out. But I wanted even more riding time, and as a result, I often rode alone.

An acquaintance told me about a club for riders over 40 and owning any brand of bike. They were the **Retreads** and their club was a loosely knit organization. I joined them, but it seemed like we lacked a common denominator. I mean, who wants to talk about Harleys and Hondas all the time. So, I encouraged the other Beemer riders to join a BMW club. There was no local club at the time, so I organized one. Ozzie's BMW Center, Joe Sarkee's Motorcycles, and J&J Precision Cycle Works helped a great deal by giving me the names of BMW owners in this area. I sent postcards to each, informing




them of a meeting to be held in Carmichael Park on Halloween 1982 to discuss formation of a club. Thirty-one (31) riders attended and most all liked the idea of a local BMW club.

I tried to get a volunteer to take this group and build a club as recommended by the majority of members. No one volunteered and several persons suggested that I serve as Director, Leader, or whatever, and we would rotate every six months. After each six months, no one wanted the job. We were an informal group with no officers, no business meetings, and no dues. I published a newsletter and collected \$5.00 a year from those that wanted the newsletter. Everyone subscribed. As we grew in numbers, it was clear that everyone liked the club as it was. At the time we were known as the **No Name BMW Club**.

Some thought we should have a more meaningful club name. The January '83 newsletter asked for recommendations for a club name. Our members showed their creativity with 42 different alternatives!



Below are a few highlights and participants.




Larry's Sidecar – Warm up in the paddock





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























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A&S hired a videographer to film parts of the day. Thanks again Randy!!

Alaska 2023

The best laid plans of mice and men really does change sometimes. With Covid, and border closings our trip two years ago went away. I was hoping for a trip this year, but that didn't come together. I am hoping for a trip in 2023 in early July.

I would like to leave the first Saturday after the fourth of July.

The trip is now set for 15 days. We will go north up through Boise for the first stop, then up to Kalispell Montana, and if it is open highway to the sun in Glacier Park. A little bit of heaven. Then on up Banff British Columbia, No. to lake Louise, to Jasper, and on to Prince George. From Prince George to Fort Nelson, from there across the Canadian Rockies to White Horse, in the Yukon gold country. The next day we head for Fairbanks, Alaska. We will have a day to rest, sight see and do laundry. From there we will head to Anchorage, with a stop at Denali Nat. Park. We then head south to Hanes Junction.

At that point you can get on a ferry to Prince Rupert. It is 1&1/2 days with a cabin to stay overnight on board. The cost for that is about \$700.00 with the cabin and add \$200.00 more if you are riding double. The ferry will pass Haines, Juneau, and on south through the inside passage, and on to Prince Rupert.

We will then board another ferry and go to Port Hardy on Vancouver Island. The ferry is about \$600.00, add \$200.00 more if riding double. It takes 14 hours to Port Hardy. You will have option to not go on ferries, by riding 3 days to Vancouver B.C. You might save some money, but not much with hotels and fuel.

From Port Hardy we will ride south to take a short ferry to Port Angeles, Washington, USA. From there it is 2 days south to home, mostly on the coast.

What you will need: good rain gear, a bike that is well maintained with new tires, be willing to ride some long days, if it is not raining. Tiedowns for your bike on the ferries. and about \$5,000 to \$6,000 in the bank for food, fuel, and lodging. You will see some of the most beautiful sights in the world and get home happy but tired.
